


Teaching gives you the opportunity to have a real impact on the lives of others.

Great teachers show us things about ourselves we can't see. They see potential in us that others, including ourselves, can't or won't.


Above all, they give us the courage to find our own way with just enough guidance to show us that the impossible – or what we perceive as impossible – is anything but that.

Impact

• Emily Blunt: From Stutter to Stage — Emily is a Golden Globe-nominated film and stage actress. However, between the ages of 7 and 14 she developed a crippling stutter that had her struggling to even hold a simple conversation. "I never thought I'd be able to sit and talk to someone" For Emily, it was one teacher that she claims helped her overcome her fear of speaking by encouraging her to try out for the school play. The teacher wouldn't give up on her and coaxed her to take acting lessons and experiment with different accents and character voices.



• Maya Angelou: Finding a Voice — Before Maya became a powerful poet and civil rights activist, she suffered a life of torment and darkness that nearly stole her voice forever. It all changed one day with the help of a teacher named Bertha Flowers. Angelou credited Mrs. Flowers for helping her find her own voice a Mrs. Flowers introduced Angelou to Dickens, Shakespeare, Poe, and several other prolific writers who would come to greatly influence her personal and professional philosophies.



Impact

• Bill Gates: Questions that Matter - "When I first met Mrs. Caffiere, I was a timid fourth grader. I was desperately trying to go unnoticed because I had some big deficits. Mrs. Caffiere took me under her wing and helped make it okay for me to be a messy, nerdy boy who was reading lots of books." He credits Mrs. Caffiere for helping him escape his shell in the true spirit of exceptional teaching. she'd go out of her way to source books that were progressively more interesting and challenging for him. once he'd read them, she would ask him if he liked what he had read and what he'd learned and

why.



Qualified Teaching Status

- Awarded by the DfE
- Recommended by Providers of ITT (following your training and based on meeting The Teachers' Standards)
- Some courses have PGCEs as integral
- Some courses have Masters Credits

Ask these questions when researching providers



Department for Education





- To train with most providers it is likely you will need:
 - A **degree** from a United Kingdom higher education institution or equivalent qualification;
 - GCSEs at level 4 (or equivalent) in Mathematics, Science and English
 - The ability to communicate clearly in written and spoken standard English
 - To be fit to teach and DBS checked
 - Secondary applicants should ideally have a degree that is 50% relevant to the subject in which they wish to train to teach

- · You need to decide:
 - Do you need a salary?
 - Can you train full time?
 - Do you want to train part time?
 - Do you want a PGCE aspect or Masters credits?
 - What are range do you want to teach?
 - How far can you travel to train?
 - Do you want to train in the area you want to teach?
 - Do you want to teach a specific subject?
 - Do you want to specialise (for example in SEND or behaviour/early years)?


Teacher training providers in the Hub area




